The two-month feasibility study planned to assess whether the Pulverised Fuel Ash, (PFA) is a suitable material to create a lunar-simulated environment for testing Space-designed technologies and hardware.


February 5th 'The Lost Towns of Glamorgan'

Flat Holm has a unique island character, with a sense of wilderness, remoteness and isolation, as well as extensive views from, and across the island to the coasts of England and Wales. Less than half a mile wide, the tiny island is an intriguing hidden jewel in the Bristol Channel.

Designated a Site of Special Scientific Interest and Local Nature Reserve, the Flat Holm Project conserves the island's natural and cultural features, from maritime grassland to Victorian barracks, from seabird colonies to wartime bunkers.
