

Cardiff Bay Yacht Club
Dinghy Racing Series 2026

NOTICE OF RACE (NOR)

1. Cardiff Bay Yacht Club (CBYC) will be the Organising Authority. A racing programme giving the details of the races, including dates and times, will be published on the CBYC website.
2. Events are governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
3. The Sailing Instructions (SI) can be found on the CBYC website.
4. Racing is open to all members of CBYC and Cardiff Yacht Club who have paid racing fees.

Fees for 2026 are:

Over 18's : £5 / series or £25 / year.

Under 18's (on 1st Jan 2026) : Entry is Free

Entry and payment of fees is made on the CBYC website or by contacting the CBYC office.

5. All dinghy classes that have a PY handicap number are eligible to race.
6. The club SI's change the following rules of the RRS:
 - a. Rule 40.1 applies at all times whilst afloat.
7. Members who participate in racing:
 - a. agree to be bound by the Racing Rules of Sailing, the SI's, and
 - b. will ensure their boat is adequately insured in accordance with CBYC club requirements for the entire duration of the Series, with cover of at least £3 million against third party claims, and
 - c. agree to participate in performing race duties as required and will arrange for a suitable replacement if they cannot, for whatever reason, fulfil their allocated duty.
8. Schedule of races and start times is available on the CBYC website along with a list of the race duty allocations.
9. Sailors are reminded that it is their responsibility to ensure their equipment is in compliance with their class rules.
10. Courses are defined in the SI's.
11. Scoring is defined in the SI's. Prizes will be presented at the end of season prizegiving.

12. Code of Conduct

Competitors should note that the CBYC implements the RYA Racing Charter and that they will be expected to sail in compliance with it. The charter can be found at the front of the RYA edition of the Racing Rules of Sailing 2025-2028 (the yellow pages after the definitions), or on the RYA website at www.rya.org.uk/racingrules.

13. Risk Statement is defined in the SI's.

14. Privacy Statement

The personal information you provide to the organizing authority will be used to facilitate your participation in the events. If you have agreed to be bound by the Racing Rules of Sailing and the other rules that govern the event (the rules), the legal basis for processing that personal information is contract. If you are not bound by the rules, the legal basis for processing that personal information is legitimate interest. Your personal information will be stored and used in accordance with the organizing authority's privacy policy. When required by the rules, personal information may be shared with the RYA, your national authority and/or World Sailing. The results of the event and the outcome of any hearing or appeal may be published.
